Dear Resident:

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is pleased to inform you that, as a result of your petition, the 600 block of Princeton Place, N.W., have been approved as part of the Residential Permit Parking (RPP) Program. This program is designed to allow residents more convenient access to their homes by restricting commuters from parking all day on residential streets. The restrictions for your block will become **effective Monday, April 16, 2015.**

You will be exempt from the parking restrictions after obtaining a residential sticker for your vehicle. The instructions on the reverse side of this letter explain how residents may secure these stickers.

DDOT is confident that this program will reduce illegal parking, traffic congestion and air pollution in your neighborhood and thus alleviate many of the inconveniences that you have experienced from commuter parking over the years.

RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING
PERMIT ISSUANCE PROCEDURES**

No vehicle may park longer than two hours in a Residential Permit Parking (RPP) zone without a valid RPP permit properly displayed.

TO OBTAIN A PERMIT:

- You must be a resident of an approved block.
- You must have a current, valid registration or reciprocity permit for each vehicle and show proof of vehicle insurance.
- Residential parking permits are \$35.00 per vehicle, per year. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the D.C. Treasurer.
- Proof of residency (e.g., executed lease, utility bill bearing applicant's name and address, deed or settlement sheet) is required.
- If the applicant does not own the vehicle (e.g., leased vehicle, company car), then additional documentation will be required.
- Commercial vehicles are not eligible to receive RPP permits.
- Permits may be issued for two years or less, expiring with the vehicle registration.
- Residents with reciprocity permits will not receive further notice of expiration. Such residents must reapply for an RPP permit.
- The Metropolitan Police Department District Station in each ward issues visitor permits for periods up to fifteen days.
